MONDAY, Oct. 1

The Neighborhood

Comedian **Cedric the Entertainer**, **Beth** (*2 Broke Girls*) **Behrs** and **Tichina Arnold** star in this new sitcom about

A Trio of Comedy Sequels

Settle in for a triple dose of double-down fun with these back-to-back follow-up flicks: ***Anchorman 2: The Legend Continues, Ride Along 2*** and ***Grownups 2***, with the antics of **Will Ferrell, Paul Rudd, Steve Carell, Ice Cube, Kevin Hart, Adam Sandler, Kevin James, Chris Rock and David Spade** (3:30 p.m., FXX).

THURSDAY, Oct. 4

Will & Grace

Former *Friends* star **David Schwimmer** begins his recurring role as Grace's love interest beginning in tonight's second season of the rebooted sitcom starring **Debra Messing, Eric McCormack, Sean Hayes and Megan Mullally**. Other guest stars this season will include **Alec Baldwin, Chelsea Handler and Mary McCormack** (9 p.m., NBC).

Station 19

Fresh off his run from the cancelled *Code Black* on CBS, **Boris Kodjoe** heats up season two of this drama in a recurring role as a “seasoned firefighter with a mysterious past,” returning to Seattle’s Station 19 after an extended absence in a way that doesn’t sit well with the rest of the crew (**Jaina Lee Ortiz, Jason George, Grey Damon**) (9 p.m., ABC).

FRIDAY, Oct. 5

Into the Dark

New monthly horror anthology series bearing the Blumhouse brand kicks off with “The Body,” starring **Tom Bateman** as a hitman tasked with transporting a body on Halloween night—and everyone he meets thinks he’s wearing a “killer” costume (streaming on Hulu).

The Man in the High Castle

How would things be different if the Axis powers had won World War II? This dystopian alternate-history series, based on a novel by acclaimed sci-fi writer **Phillip K. Dick**, kicks off season three with more deep-dish Nazis-in-North-America drama.

SATURDAY, Oct. 6

Svengoolie Classic Horror & Sci-Fi Movie: The Return of the Vampire

Columbia Pictures originally intended this 1944 film as a sequel to *Dracula* (1931), but changed the title to avoid a lawsuit from

Universal, which owned the rights. **Bela “Dracula” Lugosi** starred, nonetheless, in what is regarded to be the first horror flick to include both a vampire *and* a werewolf (8 p.m., HBO).

Versailles

In the third and final season of the 17th century historical drama, encouraged by his latest mistress (**Catherine Walker**), King Louis XIV (**George Blagden**) seeks to expand his empire by annexing Spain while Queen Marie-Therese (**Else Lasowski**) is wooed by King Leopold (**Rory Keenan**) and Prince Phillippe (**Alexander Vlahos**) tries to find out what is known by the prisoner known as the man in the iron mask (10 p.m., Ovation).

SUNDAY, Oct. 7


iHeartRadio Music Awards


NEW ON DVD




The bonus features alone are enough to make the 10th anniversary edition of *Step Brothers* (Sony Pictures Home Entertainment) a cause for celebration. The 4K+Blu-ray+Digital edition of the 2008 **Will Ferrell/John C. Riley** comedy classic comes with an unrated version of the movie and previously unreleased material, including a gag reel, Line-o-Rama, a full music video for “Boats ‘N

Hoes,” extended “job interviews,” and commentary by Ferrell, O’Reilly and **Adam McKay**.


It was the fourth installment in the popular horror franchise, but *The First Purge: A Nation Reborn* (Universal Pictures Home Entertainment) stakes its claim before the events of the previous films—that is, at the very beginning of a (future) time in America when, for one night, all crime is legal. Let the mayhem and murder begin—and find out how the films got their bloody start.





Benecio Del Toro and **Josh Brolin** reprise their roles in *Sicario: Day of the Soldado* (Sony Pictures Home Entertainment), a scorching sequel to the 2015 action-crime saga about the escalating drug-cartel war on the U.S.-Mexican border. With **Catherine Keener**, **Jeffrey Donovan**, **Matthew Modine** and **Isabela Moner**, who plays the kidnapped daughter of a cartel kingpin.

Hollywood takes on the strange but true tale of how a pro baseball player became involved in WWII espionage in *The Catcher Was a Spy* (Paramount Home Media). **Paul Rudd** as Moe Berg, the Princeton-educated, multilingual Boston Red Sox catcher who was enlisted in 1944 to go behind enemy lines in Europe to assassinate the Nazi's chief nuclear scientist before he could develop the nuclear bomb. With **Mark Strong**, **Sienna Miller**, **Jeff Daniels**, **Guy Pearce** and **Paul Giamatti**.
